


Flesh Tone Palette

The colors available in the Flesh Tone Palette range from the palest of pink tones to the deepest of rich yellow tones. The system contains skin tone colors with warming/cooling adjusters that are ideal for fine tuning a perfectly matched skin tone mix or for creating a subtle bruising tone for close-up camera work. All of the color adjusters have been formulated to intermix with the Flesh tones.

Dark Flesh Tone Palette

The Dark Flesh Tone Palette is designed as the follow-up to the original Flesh Tone palette. The Dark colors complete the entire range of Flesh tones. When combined with the FX and light Flesh Tone colors, the Dark Flesh Tone colors will allow the artist to duplicate virtually any skin tone, no matter how light or dark.



Two of the colors, Soot and Powder, have been introduced with the tag "Puma," meaning, "smoke." They are designed to have a serendipitous smoke quality that can be built up into overlapping patterns. Laying down layers of Soot followed by streaks of Black from the "FX" palette will introduce layering effects that add more depth than using either color alone.





Skin Illustrator Tips

Be sure the skin has been thoroughly cleaned and dried before applying the Skin Illustrator colors. Removal is easy with Super Solv, Super Solv Plus, Telesis Makeup Remover, IPM-Gel or alcohol. Remember to clean the skin after color removal, then apply moisturizer.

All Skin Illustrator liquids can be used to replenish the palettes. To refill the palette cells, shake bottles well, squirt a thin layer of desired color into cell, stir, and Pan dry. Repeat the process until the cell is filled. The key to using Skin Illustrator is to take the time to experiment with the colors. Try different application techniques with a sponge, brush or airbrush, and learn how the colors work under varying conditions. Because art is constantly evolving, Skin Illustrator will always be growing and improving.

Hair Illustrator is available in both palettes and liquids. All Hair and Skin Illustrator palettes must be activated with 'Activator', 'Slow Activator', or 99% alcohol. Do not use anything else.

The Warm Blond Palette is excellent for everything blond. From adding subtle tones to creating chunking effects and fixing those dark roots. Leave the peroxide at home!




Slow Activator



Dirt-Tac is a clear gel made to be used with Dirt Bags when only a powdered look is required. Dirt-Tac also helps hold the powders in place.

Caution: Skin Illustrator in liquid form is flammable (alcohol). Use in a well ventilated area. Do not inhale fumes. Do not use on cut or abraded skin. For external use only. Do not use near a source of ignition. Use caution near the eyes. Keep away from children. Comply with all OSHA safety precautions when spraying Liquid Skin Illustrator (99% alcohol). Full body applications require an approved paint booth with spark proof ventilation equipment. Contact your Production Safety coordinator for information. Small spraying applications, such as an air brush, can be treated as an aerosol hair spray. Repeated use of any alcohol activated color can cause drying of the skin. Moisturize skin thoroughly after every application. If irritation occurs, discontinue use and apply moisturizer.
